## The Constitution

We first go back to the summer of 1787, Independence Hall, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where the framers of the U. S. Constitution met to outline a new government.


## The Constitution: Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

## The Constitution: Article I

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, . . .

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The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand, but each State shall have at Least one Representative; ...

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> Members deliver credentials to the Clerk.
